

Day 1 Oct. 21 (Tue)

Departure for Xi'an





Our journey begins in Shenzhen. In the afternoon, we fly to Xi'an – the legendary ancient capital known for its Terracotta Warriors, city walls, and deep cultural heritage.

Day 2 Oct. 22 (Wed)



In the morning, Visit Xi'an attraction-The Tang Paradise.

The Tang Paradise, located southeast of the Giant Wild Goose Pagoda in Yanta District, Xi'an City, Shaanxi Province, covers an area of 1,000 mu, of which 300 mu is water. Rebuilt north of the site of the original Furong Garden of the Tang Dynasty, following the architectural style of the Tang imperial gardens, the Tang Paradise is China's first large-scale imperial garden-style cultural theme park that comprehensively showcases the grandeur of the prosperous Tang Dynasty.

In the afternoon, tour the Museum of the Terracotta Army, also known as the Terracotta Warriors and Horses or the Qin Terracotta Warriors. The museum is part of the larger Mausoleum of the First Qin Emperor complex, with the terracotta figures serving as burial objects.

The Terracotta Army is widely known as the "Eighth Wonder of the World." Over a thousand life-sized terracotta soldiers have been unearthed here, each with unique facial expressions and lifelike postures. These masterpieces are considered shining examples in the history of ancient Chinese sculpture and have been hailed as one of the greatest archaeological discoveries of the 20th century.



Day 3 Oct. 23 (Thurs)

Beijing





Visit Beijing Zoo in the morning.

Beijing Zoo was founded in the 32nd year of Emperor Guangxu's reign of the Qing Dynasty (1906). It is the earliest opened zoo in China and the one that keeps and displays the largest number of animal species. It receives over 6 million visitors from home and abroad every year.

In the afternoon, visit The Palace Museum, located in the heart of Beijing along the city's central axis. Formerly known as the Forbidden City, it served as the imperial palace during the Ming and Qing Dynasties. Centered around the Three Great Halls, the Forbidden City covers approximately 720,000 square meters, with a total floor area of about



150,000 square meters. In 1961, it was designated as one of China's first national key cultural heritage sites. In 1987, it was inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Day 4 Oct. 24 (Fri)

Beijing





In the morning, tour the Temple of Heaven Park, originally named the "Altar of Heaven and Earth," was first built in the 18th year of the Yongle reign of the Ming Dynasty (1420). In the 9th year of the Jiajing reign (1530), it was renamed the "Temple of Heaven." It served as the site where emperors of the Ming and Qing Dynasties performed ceremonies to worship Heaven and pray for good harvests. Covering a total area of 273 hectares, it is the largest existing ancient sacrificial architectural complex in China.

In the afternoon, visit Mutianyu section of the Great Wall.

In 1987, the Mutianyu section of the Great






Wall was inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List. In 2000, the local government of Huairou District designated it as a scenic area. On May 25, 2006, the State Council of the People's Republic of China included Mutianyu, along with other sections of the Great Wall, in the sixth group of national key cultural heritage sites, consolidating it under the fifth batch of protected Great Wall sections. In 2011, it was rated a national 5A-level tourist attraction by the China National Tourism Administration.

Day 5 Oct. 25 (Sat)

Beijing



In the morning, visit The Prince Kung's Palace, built during the Qianlong reign of the Qing Dynasty, Prince Kung's Palace is China's best-preserved complex of princely mansions. It is divided into two parts: the residence and the garden, with the former in the front and the latter at the rear. The front half is a magnificent residence, while the rear half is a serene and elegant classical garden, covering a total area of nearly 60,000 square meters.







ostentation. With open corridors and continuous roof ridges, they exude grandeur, second only to imperial palaces. The Cuijin Garden behind the residence is surrounded by water and mountains, with towering ancient trees, winding corridors, pavilions, and natural beauty. The ever-changing scenery and well-arranged spatial patterns make it a model of Chinese garden architecture.

In the afternoon, tour The Summer Palace, which was announced as one of China's first national key cultural heritage sites by the State Council. In December 1998, it was listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Day 6 Oct. 26 (Sun)

Beijing-Shanghai



In the morning, free time or visit Qianmen Street, a historic commercial avenue that dates back to the Ming and Qing dynasties. Lined with traditional architecture and modern shops, it offers a unique blend of old and new Beijing.

In the afternoon, travel from Beijing to Shanghai attend a welcome dinner at The Bund.

The Bund stretches about 1.5 kilometers and is one of Shanghai's most iconic landmarks. It is renowned for its diverse architectural styles—often referred to as the "International Architecture Exhibition"—and its stunning night views of the riverfront skyline.



Day 7 Oct. 27 (Mon)

Shanghai-Suzhou

In the morning, visit Shanghai's Yu Garden: Originally built during the Jiajing and Wanli reigns of the Ming Dynasty, Yu Garden has a history of over 450 years. Together with Luxiang Garden and Rishiyuan Garden, it was known as one of the "Three Famous Gardens of Ming Dynasty Shanghai." Today, it ranks first among the five major surviving classical gardens in Shanghai.

In the afternoon, travel to Suzhou, a historic city renowned for its exquisite classical gardens, centuries-old silk tradition, and peaceful canals. With a history of over 2,500 years, it blends refined beauty with rich cultural heritage, making it one of China's most graceful and artistic cities.

Day 8 Oct. 28 (Tues)

Suzhou-Shanghai

In the morning, visit to Suzhou Attraction –Tiger Hill Scenic Area. The entire scenic area covers 72.8 hectares, with a core area of 15.97 hectares. It boasts a rich history of over 2,500 years. In 2014, the Yunyan Pagoda (Leaning Pagoda) of the Tiger Hill Scenic Area was inscribed as part of the Grand Canal on the UNESCO World Heritage List. The hill itself is formed from Jurassic volcanic magma.

In the afternoon, travel from Suzhou to Shanghai airport for departure.
